The Oklahoma Hunter and Jumper Association (OHJA) is Oklahoma's original horse show organization. Established in 1964, OHJA was created to promote the sport of riding and showing hunters and jumpers. OHJA is dedicated to serving the best interests of its members, member shows, and their exhibitors. OHJA furthers the objectives and abides by the rules of the United States Equestrian Federation, (USEF) and United States Hunter Jumper Association (USHJA), the national governing body of our sport, to which OHJA is affiliated.

INTRODUCTION

This Manual was adopted by the Oklahoma Hunter Jumper Association ("OHJA") as of August 10, 2003, to be effective as of December 1, 2002. Terms used in this Manual shall have the meaning assigned below. Terms not defined below shall have the meaning assigned thereto in the OHJA Bylaws.

- (A) **Academy Horse.** A horse that is actively used by multiple riders in a lesson program.
- (B) **Competition Year.** December 1 through the following November 30.
- (C) **Horse.** All references in this Manual to a horse or horses will also be a reference to ponies, unless specifically stated otherwise.
- (D) **OHJA Recognized Competition.** Defined in Section 3.1 of the OHJA Bylaws.
- (E) **Points Tables.** The Points Tables included in Appendix A to this Manual.
- (F) **USEF.** United States Equestrian Federation, Inc.
- (G) **USEF Rules.** The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. Rules now in effect and as such Rules may hereafter be amended. Any amendment to any USEF Rule referenced in these By-Laws will be effective for purposes of these By-Laws on the effective date of the amendment to USEF Rule.
- (H) **USHJA.** United States Hunter Jumper Association

This Manual may be amended in the same manner as the OHJA Bylaws may be amended.

PART I—OHJA SCHOOLING PROGRAM
Classes, Sections, and Awards

1. Lead Line and Mini-Stirrup Section

(A) Lead Line Classes.

(1) Class Requirements.

- (a) No fences.
- (b) Judged on hunter seat equitation while being led.

(2) Horse/Rider Eligibility.

- (a) Open to non-professional riders age 6 and under at the beginning of the OHJA Recognized Competition.
- (b) Rider may not cross enter into any over fence class at the same OHJA Recognized Competition.

(3) OHJA Awards. None.

(B) Mini-Stirrup Classes.

(1) Class Requirements.

- (a) Mini-Stirrup classes may include walk, walk/trot, and walk/trot over rails.
- (b) Rails will not exceed 4" diameter.

(2) Horse/Rider Eligibility.

- (a) Open to non-professional riders.
- (b) Rider may not cross enter into any other over fence class at the same OHJA Recognized Competition.

(3) OHJA Awards. None.

2. Academy Short and Long Stirrup Section

(A) Academy Short and Long Stirrup Hunter Seat Equitation Classes.

(1) Class Requirements.

- (a) Fence heights 18".
- (b) Trotting will not be penalized.
- (c) Flat classes walk, trot only.

(2) Horse/Rider Eligibility.

- (a) Open to non-professional riders, age 10 and under for Short Stirrup and 11 and over for Long Stirrup.
- (b) Not open (for judging) to any rider who prior to the current Competition Year rode in any class with fence heights 2'9" or higher at any USEF, OHJA, HJEO, or GO show.
- (c) Not open (for judging) to any rider who has won a year end Champion or Reserve Champion in the Academy Short and Long Stirrup Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter), the Short Stirrup Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter) or the Long Stirrup Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter).
- (d) Horse must be an Academy Horse. At OHJA Recognized Schooling Competitions the Academy Horse may have multiple riders in the class.
- (e) If Academy Short or Long Stirrup Hunter Seat Equitation Classes are offered at an OHJA Recognized Competition but do not fill, points won by a rider on an Academy Horse in Short or Long Stirrup Hunter Seat Equitation Classes at the same OHJA Recognized Competition will be awarded to the rider's Academy Short and Long Stirrup Hunter Seat Equitation points.

(3) OHJA Awards. OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the riders accumulating the most points in Academy Short and Long Stirrup Hunter Seat Equitation classes during the Competition Year.

(B) Academy Short and Long Stirrup Hunter Classes.

(1) Class Requirements.

- (a) Fence heights 18”.
- (b) Trotting will not be penalized.
- (c) Flat classes walk, trot only.

(2) Horse/Rider Eligibility.

- (a) Open to non-professional riders, age 10 and under for Short Stirrup and 11 and over for Long Stirrup.
- (b) Not open (for judging) to any rider who prior to the current Competition Year rode in any class with fence heights 2’9” or higher at any USEF, OHJA, HJEO, or GO show.
- (c) Not open (for judging) to any rider who has won a year end Champion or Reserve Champion in the Academy Short and Long Stirrup Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter), the Short Stirrup Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter) or the Long Stirrup Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter).
- (d) Horse must be an Academy Horse. At OHJA Recognized Schooling Competitions the Academy Horse may have multiple riders in the class.
- (e) Points are awarded to the rider, not a horse/rider combination. If Academy Short or Long Stirrup Hunter Classes are offered at an OHJA Recognized Competition but do not fill, points won by a rider on an Academy Horse in Short or Long Stirrup Hunter Classes at the same OHJA Recognized Competition will be awarded to the rider’s Academy Short and Long Stirrup Hunter points.

- (3) OHJA Awards.** OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the riders accumulating the most points in Academy Short and Long Stirrup Hunter classes during the Competition Year.

3. Short Stirrup Section

(A) Short Stirrup Hunter Seat Equitation Classes.

(1) Class Requirements.

- (a) Fence heights 18”.
- (b) Flat classes walk, trot only.
- (c) Short and Long Stirrup Hunter Seat Equitation classes may be combined.

(2) Horse/Rider Eligibility.

- (a) Open to non-professional riders, age 10 and under.
- (b) Not open (for judging) to any rider who prior to the current Competition Year rode in any class with fence heights 2’9” or higher at any USEF, OHJA or HJEO show.
- (c) Not open (for judging) to any rider who has won a year end Champion or Reserve Champion in the Short Stirrup Hunter Seat Equitation Section.
- (d) Not open to riders riding Academy Horses, unless the Academy Short Stirrup Hunter Seat Equitation Classes are offered but do not fill. In that event, points won by a rider on an Academy Horse in Short Stirrup Hunter Seat Equitation Classes will be awarded to the rider’s Academy Short Stirrup Hunter Seat Equitation points.

- (3) OHJA Awards.** OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the riders accumulating the most points in Short Stirrup Hunter Seat Equitation classes during the Competition Year. Competition in this division will be limited to not more than two (2) years.

(B) Short Stirrup Hunter Classes.

(1) Class Requirements.

- (a) Fence heights 18”.
- (b) Flat classes walk, trot only.
- (c) Short and Long Stirrup Hunter classes may be combined.

(2) Horse/Rider Eligibility.

- (a) Open to all horses ridden by non-professional riders, age 10 and under.
- (b) Not open (for judging) to any rider who prior to the current Competition Year rode in any class with fence heights 2’9” or higher at any USEF, OHJA or HJEO show.
- (c) Not open (for judging) to any rider who has won a year end Champion or Reserve Champion in the Academy Short and Long Stirrup Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter), the Short Stirrup Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter) or the Long Stirrup Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter).
- (d) Not open to riders riding Academy Horses unless the Academy Short Stirrup Hunter Classes are offered but do not fill. In that event, points won by a rider on an Academy Horse in Short Stirrup Hunter Classes will be awarded to the rider’s Academy Short Stirrup Hunter points.

(3) OHJA Awards. OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horse and rider combinations accumulating the most points in Short Stirrup Rider Hunter classes during the Competition Year. Competition in this division will be limited to not more than two (2) years.

4. Long Stirrup Section

(A) Long Stirrup Hunter Seat Equitation Classes.

(1) Class Requirements.

- (a) Fence heights 18”.
- (b) Flat classes walk, trot only.
- (c) Short and Long Stirrup Hunter Seat Equitation classes may be combined.

(2) Horse/Rider Eligibility.

- (a) Open to non-professional riders, 11 and over.
- (b) Not open (for judging) to any rider who prior to the current Competition Year rode in any class with fence heights 2’9” or higher at any USEF, OHJA or HJEO show.
- (c) Not open (for judging) to any rider who has won a year end Champion or Reserve Champion in the Academy Short and Long Stirrup Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter), the Short Stirrup Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter) or the Long Stirrup Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter).
- (d) Not open to riders riding Academy Horses unless the Academy Long Stirrup Hunter Seat Equitation Classes are offered but do not fill. In that event, points won by a rider riding an Academy Horse in Long Stirrup Hunter Seat Equitation Classes will be awarded to the rider’s Academy Long Stirrup Hunter Seat Equitation points.

(3) OHJA Awards. OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the riders accumulating the most points in Long Stirrup Hunter Seat Equitation classes during the Competition Year. Competition in this division will be limited to not more than two (2) years.

- (B) Long Stirrup Hunter Classes.**
- (1) Class Requirements.**
- (a) Fence heights 18”.
 - (b) Flat classes walk, trot only.
 - (c) Short and Long Stirrup Hunter classes may be combined.
- (2) Horse/Rider Eligibility.**
- (a) Open to all horses ridden by non-professional riders, age 11 and over
 - (b) Not open (for judging) to any rider who prior to the current Competition Year rode in any class with fence heights 2’9” or higher at any USEF, OHJA or HJEO show.
 - (c) Not open (for judging) to any rider who has won a year end Champion or Reserve Champion in the Academy Short and Long Stirrup Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter), the Short Stirrup Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter) or the Long Stirrup Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter).
 - (d) Not open to riders riding Academy Horses unless the Academy Long Stirrup Hunter Classes are offered but do not fill. In that event, points won by a rider on an Academy Horse in Long Stirrup Hunter Classes will be awarded to the rider’s Academy Long Stirrup Hunter points.
- (3) OHJA Awards.** OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horse and rider combinations accumulating the most points in Long Stirrup Rider Hunter classes during the Competition Year. Competition in this division will be limited to not more than two (2) years.

5. Academy Beginner Rider Section

- (A) Academy Beginner Rider Hunter Seat Equitation Classes.**
- (1) Class Requirements.**
- (a) Fence heights 2’3”.
 - (b) Trotting will not be penalized.
- (2) Horse/Rider Eligibility.**
- (a) Open to non-professional riders.
 - (b) Not open (for judging) to any rider who prior to the current Competition Year rode in any class with fence heights 2’9” or higher at any USEF, OHJA or HJEO show.
 - (c) Not open (for judging) to any rider who has won a year end Champion or Reserve Champion in the Academy Beginner Rider Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter) or the Beginner Rider Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter).
 - (d) Horse must be an Academy Horse. At OHJA Recognized Schooling Competitions the Academy Horse may have multiple riders in the class.
 - (e) If Academy Beginner Rider Hunter Seat Equitation Classes are offered at an OHJA Recognized Competition but do not fill, points won by a rider on an Academy Horse in Beginner Hunter Seat Equitation Classes at the same OHJA Recognized Competition will be awarded to the rider’s Academy Beginner Hunter Seat Equitation points.
- (3) OHJA Awards.** OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the riders accumulating the most points in Academy Beginner Rider classes during the Competition Year.

(B) Academy Beginner Rider Hunter Classes.

(1) Class Requirements.

- (a) Fence heights 2'3".
- (b) Trotting will not be penalized.

(2) Horse/Rider Eligibility.

- (a) Open to all horses ridden by non-professional riders.
- (b) Not open (for judging) to any rider who prior to the current Competition Year rode in any class with fence heights 2'9" or higher at any USEF, OHJA or HJEO show.
- (c) Not open (for judging) to any rider who has won a year end Champion or Reserve Champion in the Academy Beginner Rider Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter) or the Beginner Rider Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter).
- (d) Horse must be an Academy Horse. At OHJA Recognized Schooling Competitions the Academy Horse may have multiple riders in the class.
- (e) Points are awarded to the rider, not a horse/rider combination. If Beginner Hunter Classes are offered at an OHJA Recognized Competition but do not fill, points won by a rider on an Academy Horse in Beginner Hunter Classes at the same OHJA Recognized Competition will be awarded to the rider's Academy Beginner Hunter points.

(3) OHJA Awards. OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the riders accumulating the most points in Academy Beginner Rider Hunter classes during the Competition Year.

6. Beginner Rider Section

(A) Beginner Rider Hunter Seat Equitation Classes.

(1) Class Requirements. Fence heights 2'3".

(2) Horse/Rider Eligibility.

- (a) Open to non-professional riders.
- (b) Not open (for judging) to any rider who prior to the current Competition Year rode in any class with fence heights 2'9" or higher at any USEF, OHJA or HJEO show.
- (c) Not open (for judging) to any rider who has won a year end Champion or Reserve Champion in the Academy Beginner Rider Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter) or the Beginner Rider Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter).

(3) OHJA Awards. OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the riders accumulating the most points in Beginner Rider classes during the Competition Year.

(B) Beginner Rider Hunter Classes.

(1) Class Requirements. Fence heights 2'3".

(2) Horse/Rider Eligibility.

- (a) Open to all horses ridden by non-professional riders.
- (b) Not open (for judging) to any rider who prior to the current Competition Year rode in any class with fence heights 2'9" or higher at any USEF, OHJA or HJEO show.
- (c) Not open (for judging) to any rider who has won a year end Champion or Reserve Champion in the Academy Beginner Rider Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter) or the Beginner Rider Section (either Hunter Seat Equitation or Hunter).

(3) OHJA Awards. OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horse and rider combinations accumulating the most points in Beginner Rider Hunter classes during the Competition Year.

7. Intermediate Rider Section

(A) Intermediate Rider Hunter Seat Equitation Classes.

- (1) **Class Requirements.** Fence heights 2'6".
- (2) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.**
 - (a) Not open to professional riders
 - (b) Not open to riders who have entered classes with any fence heights of 3'0" or higher at the same OHJA Recognized Competition.
 - (c) Not open (for judging) to any rider who prior to the current Competition Year rode in any class with fence heights 3'0" or higher at any USEF, OHJA or HJEO show.
 - (d) Not open (for judging) to any rider who has won a year end Champion or Reserve Champion in the Intermediate Rider Hunter Seat Equitation Section.
- (3) **OHJA Awards.** OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the riders accumulating the most points in Intermediate Hunter Seat Equitation classes during the Competition Year.

(B) Intermediate Rider Hunter Classes.

- (1) **Class Requirements.** Fence heights 2'6".
- (2) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.**
 - (a) Not open to horses ridden by professional riders.
 - (b) Not open to riders who have entered classes with any fence heights of 3'0" or higher at the same OHJA Recognized Competition.
 - (c) Not open to horses that have entered classes with any fence heights of 3'0" or higher at the same OHJA Recognized Competition.
 - (d) Not open (for judging) to any rider who prior to the current Competition Year rode in any class with fence heights 3'0" or higher at any USEF, OHJA or HJEO show.
 - (e) Not open (for judging) to any rider who has won a year end Champion or Reserve Champion in the Intermediate Rider Hunter Section.
- (3) **OHJA Awards.** OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horse and rider combinations accumulating the most points in Intermediate Rider Hunter classes during the Competition Year.

8. Rusty Stirrup Section

(A) Rusty Stirrup Hunter Seat Equitation Classes.

- (1) **Class Requirements.** Fence heights 2'3" and 2'6".
- (2) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.**
 - (a) Open (for judging) to riders 35 and older.
 - (b) Only non-professional riders may be judged.
- (3) **OHJA Awards.** OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the riders accumulating the most points in Rusty Stirrup Hunter Seat Equitation classes during the Competition Year.

(B) Rusty Stirrup Hunter Classes.

- (1) **Class Requirements.** Fence heights 2'3" and 2'6".
- (2) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.**
 - (a) Open (for judging) to riders 35 and older.
 - (b) Only non-professional riders may be judged.
- (3) **OHJA Awards.** OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horse and rider combinations accumulating the most points in Rusty Stirrup Rider Hunter classes during the Competition Year.

9. Modified Children's / Adult Section

- (A) **Modified Children's / Adult Hunter Seat Equitation Classes.**
- (1) **Class Requirements.** Fence heights 2'9".
 - (2) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** Open to non-professional riders.
 - (3) **OHJA Awards.** OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the riders accumulating the most points in Modified Children's / Adult Hunter Seat Equitation classes during the Competition Year.
- (B) **Modified Children's / Adult Hunter Classes.**
- (1) **Class Requirements.** Fence heights 2'9".
 - (2) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** Open to non-professional riders.
 - (3) **OHJA Awards.** OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horse and rider combinations accumulating the most points in Modified Children's / Adult Hunter classes during the Competition Year.

10. OHJA Very Low Hunter Section

- (A) **Class Requirements.** Fence heights 2'3"
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** Riders may be amateurs or professionals.
- (C) **OHJA Awards.** OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horses accumulating the most points in OHJA Very Low Hunter classes during the Competition Year.

11. OHJA Baby Green Hunter Section

- (A) **Class Requirements.** Fence heights 2'6".
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.**
- (1) Riders may be amateurs or professionals.
 - (2) A baby green horse is a horse of any age that has never shown in a recognized USEF Regular Member or Local Member show over fences 3'0" or higher. A horse may show in the Baby Green Hunter Section of an OHJA Recognized Competition in no more than two Competition Years.
 - (3) A horse that does not show at more than three shows prior to May 15 of a Competition Year at 3'0" or higher, may regain his baby green status on a one-time basis. In order to regain baby green status, the owner must notify the OHJA Points Secretary, via certified/return receipt prior to resumption of showing baby green in order to regain baby green status with OHJA.
- (C) **OHJA Awards.** OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horses accumulating the most points in OHJA Baby Green Hunter classes during the Competition Year. A horse may win the Champion award in Baby Green Hunter only once, even if the horse regains pre-green status.

12. OHJA Low Hunter Section

- (A) **Class Requirements.** Fence heights 2'9" to 3'0".
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** Riders may be amateurs, juniors or professionals.
- (C) **OHJA Awards.** OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horses accumulating the most points in OHJA Low Hunter classes during the Competition Year.

13. OHJA Open Hunter Section

- (A) **Class Requirements.** Fence heights 3'3" to 3'5"
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** Riders may be amateurs, juniors or professionals.
- (C) **OHJA Awards.** OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horses accumulating the most points in OHJA Schooling Open Hunter classes during the Competition Year

14. OHJA Children's Hunter Pony Section

(A) Class Requirements.

1. Fence heights: Small ponies 2'0", medium ponies 2'3", and large ponies 2'6".
2. Fence spreads not to exceed fence heights.
3. No minimum prize money required.

- a. To be judged on performance, soundness, manners, way of going, size of rider to mount, and suitability as a Children's Hunter. Ponies may be jogged for soundness at management's discretion.

(B) Horse/Rider Eligibility. Riders must be juniors.

- b. Open to ponies ridden by a Junior exhibitor with no other age restrictions applicable.
- c. The pony rider and/or pony may enter any Equitation Class at the OHJA Recognized Show.
- d. The pony/rider combination is not eligible for any USEF rated class at the same OHJA Recognized Competition.
- e. Either the pony or the rider (separately, not as a combination) may compete in any other USEF rated class at the same OHJA Recognized Competition except USEF Rated Hunter Pony classes.

(C) OHJA Awards. OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the ponies accumulating the most points in OHJA Children's Hunter Pony classes during the Competition Year.

15. OHJA 2' Hunter Section

(A) Class Requirements. Fence heights 2'

(B) Horse/Rider Eligibility. Riders may be amateurs, juniors or professionals.

(C) OHJA Awards. OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horses accumulating the most points in OHJA 2' Hunter classes during the Competition Year

Schooling Year End Awards

1. Requirements for Awards.

- (A) **Number of Riders.** The OHJA Schooling Year End Awards for an award category will not be awarded if less than three riders or three rider and horse combinations have accumulated points in the award category during the Competition Year. *Exception: If only one rider has accumulated points in a section during the show year, that rider will be presented a year end award providing he/she has shown and placed in that section at a minimum of three different shows.* Additional exceptions may be granted by the Board of Directors.
- (B) **Number of Competitions.** The OHJA Schooling Year End Awards for an award category will not be awarded if classes in which a rider or rider and horse combination may accumulate points for the award category have been conducted in less than three OHJA Recognized Competitions during the Competition Year.
- (C) **Combination/Division of Award Categories.** The award categories for the Schooling Year End Awards may be combined or divided if the entries warrant and if approved by the Board of Directors.
- (D) **Ties.** All ties for the OHJA Schooling Year End Awards will remain tied. In the event of a tie for Champion, equal awards will be presented and no Reserve Champion award will be awarded, and in the event of a tie for Reserve Champion, equal awards will be presented.

2. Requirements for Riders and Horses.

- (A) **Minimum Competitions.** To be eligible for the OHJA Schooling Year End Award in an award category, a rider must have competed in that section while a Member in a minimum of three OHJA Recognized Competitions during the Competition Year and the horse (in a horse and rider combination) must have competed in that section in a minimum of three OHJA Recognized Competitions during the Competition Year.
- (B) **Membership.** Points for riders and horse and rider combinations during a Competition Year will count towards OHJA Schooling Year End Awards from the date they become an OHJA member and will not be retroactive for points.

3. Points; Classes.

- (A) **Points.** Points for Schooling Year End Awards will be determined according to the Points Table applicable to the Schooling Year End Awards.
 - (1) Classics do not count for year end awards; only Hunter I-IV and Hunter U/S.
 - (2) Points in SS Hunter, LS Hunter, Beginner Rider Hunter, Intermediate Rider Hunter, Rusty Stirrup Hunter and Modified Ch/AA Hunter are awarded based on horse/rider combination with the rider being a current member of OHJA. All other Hunter section points are based on the horse which is owned by a current OHJA member.
- (B) **Riding not to be Judged.** As provided in the Section 3.13(C) of the OHJA Bylaws, in OHJA Recognized Schooling Competitions riding not to be judged is allowed. *Provided*, in any hunter seat equitation class, only the rider's first round may be judged and in any hunter class only the horse's first round may be judged regardless of rider (professional, junior, or amateur).
- (C) **OHJA Zones.** Points will be maintained separately for OHJA Zones 1 and 2. A rider's OHJA Zone will be determined by (i) his or her residence if in state or (ii) by the rider's election on the rider's membership application if his or her residence is out of state. A rider's points will accumulate in the rider's OHJA Zone as so determined regardless of the location of the OHJA Recognized Competition.
- (D) **OHJA Recognized Competitions.** Only points awarded at OHJA Recognized Competitions will count towards the Schooling Year End Awards.
- (E) **Number of Riders.** USEF Rules will be followed (as if the USEF Rules applied to Schooling classes) to determine if a class has sufficient entries for the class to count towards the Schooling Year End Awards. The number of riders will be determined from the report made by the OHJA Recognized Competition. If the number of riders is not known points will be awarded on the basis of three to ten riders shown.

4. Horse/Rider Eligibility. It is the responsibility of the rider or the owner or lessee of the horse to verify whether the rider or the horse is eligible for a section, class, or award.

PART II—OHJA RATED HUNTER SEAT EQUITATION PROGRAM
Classes, Sections, and Awards

1. Pony Hunter Seat Equitation Classes

- (A) **Class Requirements.** Subject to USEF Rules.
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** Subject to USEF Rules.
- (C) **OHJA Awards.** Year End Awards for Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be presented to the eligible 17 year old and under riders accumulating the most points while riding in Pony Hunter Seat Equitation classes during the Competition Year.

2. Children's Hunter Seat Equitation Classes

- (A) **Class Requirements.** Subject to USEF Rules.
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility:**
 - (1) Subject to USEF Rules.
 - (2) Children's Hunter Seat Equitation classes will be open only to junior riders who do not compete in any class with fence heights higher than 3'3" at the same OHJA Recognized Competition.
- (C) **OHJA Awards.** Year End Awards for Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be presented to the eligible 17 year old and under riders accumulating the most points in Hunter Seat Equitation classes during the Competition Year.

3. Junior Hunter Seat Equitation Classes

- (A) **Class Requirements.** Subject to USEF Rules.
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility:**
 - (1) Subject to USEF Rules.
 - (2) Junior Hunter Seat Equitation classes will be open to junior riders who are not entered in Children's equitation classes at the same OHJA Recognized Competition.
- (C) **OHJA Awards.** Year End Awards for Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be presented to the eligible 17 year old and under riders accumulating the most points in Hunter Seat Equitation classes during the Competition Year.

4. Adult Hunter Seat Equitation Classes

- (A) **Class Requirements.** Subject to USEF Rules.
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** Subject to USEF Rules.
- (C) **OHJA Awards.**
 - (1) Year End Awards for Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be presented to the eligible adult riders accumulating the most points in Hunter Seat Equitation classes during the Competition Year.
 - (2) The Millhouse Memorial Trophy will be presented through the 2011 Competition Year to the rider accumulating the most points in Adult Hunter Seat Equitation classes during the Competition Year. In the event of a tie the rider winning the most blue ribbons will receive the award. To be eligible for the Millhouse Memorial Trophy, the rider must have competed in Adult Equitation classes in a minimum of three OHJA Recognized Competitions during the Competition Year.

5. OHJA MINI MEDAL

- (A) **Class Requirements**
 - (1) Minimum of three riders must complete the course to count for year end points and year end awards.
 - (2) The class must be split if there are 30 or more entries and cannot be split if there are less than 30 entries.
 - (3) The OHJA Mini Medal Class will be shown over a figure-eight course of at least eight obstacles with heights at 2'6" and spreads to 2'6". The course will have at least one oxer and two changes in direction (lead). Additional tests (tests 1-9) of the top four to six riders are required.
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.**
 - (1) Must be a Beginner or Intermediate level rider as of December 1 of the previous year (beginning of current show year). Not open (for judging) to any rider who prior to the current Competition Year rode in any class with fence heights 2'9" or higher at any USEF, OHJA or HJEO show. No professional riders will be allowed to enter.
 - (2) Rider must be an OHJA Member; if a rider becomes a Member at an OHJA Recognized Competition in which the OHJA Mini Medal Class is held, the rider must have delivered the dues and membership application to the show secretary before the rider competes in the OHJA Mini Medal Class at that OHJA Recognized Competition.
 - (3) Rider must not ride in any 3' or higher equitation class at the same show.

- (C) **OHJA Awards.**
- (1) A gold medal (to be provided by OHJA) and ribbons through at least sixth place will be awarded.
 - (2) First and second place riders qualify for OHJA Mini Medal Ride-Off.
6. **OHJA Mini-Medal Ride-Off**
- (A) **Class Requirements.**
- (1) To be held during each Competition Year.
 - (2) To be organized by the OHJA Horse Show Committee.
 - (3) Course requirements will be consistent with courses for OHJA Mini-Medal Classes. The course will be reviewed and approved by the Horse Show Committee prior to being set by the course designer. The course must be challenging, yet jumpable, and suitable for the OHJA Mini-Medal Ride-Off.
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** Open to riders who finish first or second in any OHJA Mini-Medal Class held at any OHJA Recognized Competition either (i) during the Competition Year or (ii) during the preceding Competition Year if the rider qualifies for the OHJA Mini-Medal Ride-Off after it has been held in the preceding Competition Year. *Provided*, three riders must complete the course in any of the foregoing classes in order for the class to be a qualifying class for the OHJA Mini-Medal Ride-Off.
- (C) **OHJA Awards.** Gold, silver, and bronze appropriate awards and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded.
7. **Oklahoma Equitation Class**
- (A) **Class Requirements.**
- (1) The Oklahoma Equitation Class may be offered at any OHJA Recognized Competition where USEF Medal, ASPCA Horsemanship Class, USET Young Riders Class, USEF Adult Equitation Class, or any similar medal class except USEF Pony Medal, is offered but does not fill. More than one Oklahoma Equitation Class may be offered at a show.
 - (2) Minimum of three riders must complete the course.
 - (3) The class will be run in the same manner as the class it replaces.
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** Entries will be reopened to all Junior and Amateur riders. A win in the Oklahoma Equitation Class in any Competition Year does not eliminate that rider from participating in further Oklahoma Equitation Classes in the same Competition Year.
8. **OHJA 3' Medal Class.**
- (A) **Class Requirements**
- (1) No age break out is permitted.
 - (2) Minimum of three riders must complete the course.
 - (3) The class must be split if there are 30 or more entries and cannot be split if there are less than 30 entries.
 - (4) The OHJA 3' Medal Class will be shown over a figure-eight course of at least eight obstacles with heights at 3' and spreads to 3'. The course will have at least one oxer and two changes in direction (lead). Additional tests (tests 1-14) of the top two to six riders are required.
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.**
- (1) Rider must meet USEF definition of being a junior rider (USEF Rule-Article 116) or an amateur rider (USEF Rule-Article 808-809); no professional riders will be allowed to enter.
 - (2) Rider must be a Member; if a rider becomes a Member at an OHJA Recognized Competition in which the OHJA 3' Medal Class is held, the rider must have delivered the dues and membership application to the show secretary before the rider competes in the OHJA 3' Medal Class at that OHJA Recognized Competition.
 - (3) Rider must not have won the OHJA 3' Medal Class during the current Competition Year or the OHJA 3' Medal Ride-Off.
 - (4) Rider must not ride in any 3'6" or higher equitation class at the same show.
- (C) **OHJA Awards.**
- (1) A gold medal (to be provided by OHJA) and ribbons through at least sixth place will be awarded.
 - (2) First and second place riders qualify for OHJA 3' Medal Ride-Off.

9. **OHJA 3' Medal Ride-Off**
- (A) **Class Requirements.**
- (1) To be held during each Competition Year.
 - (2) To be organized by the OHJA Horse Show Committee.
 - (3) The OHJA 3' Medal Ride-Off course requirements will be identical to those for the OHJA 3' Medal Class. The course will be reviewed and approved by the Horse Show Committee prior to being set by the course designer. The course must be challenging, yet jumpable, and suitable for the Medal Ride-Off.
 - (4) An Equitation course over hunter style fences.
 - (5) To be held in the same ring as the Children hunters and Equitation (3') classes.
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** Open to riders who finish first or second in an OHJA 3' Medal Class either (i) during the Competition Year or (ii) during the preceding Competition Year if the rider qualifies for the OHJA 3' Medal Ride-Off after it has been held in the preceding Competition Year. A rider may compete in both the Oklahoma Medal Ride-Off and the OHJA 3' Medal Ride-Off in the same Competition Year.
- (C) **OHJA Awards.**
- (1) Gold, silver, and bronze appropriate awards and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded.
 - (2) The Jack and Daisy Moore Memorial Perpetual Trophy (and a replica of the trophy for permanent retention) will be presented to the rider winning the OHJA 3' Medal Ride-Off.
10. **Oklahoma 3'3" Medal Class.**
- (A) **Class Requirements**
- (1) No age break out is permitted.
 - (2) Minimum of three riders must complete the course.
 - (3) The class must be split if there are 30 or more entries and cannot be split if there are less than 30 entries.
 - (4) The Oklahoma 3'3" Medal Class will be shown over a figure-eight course of at least eight obstacles with heights at 3'3" and spreads to 3'3". The course will have at least one oxer and two changes in direction (lead). Additional tests (tests 1-19) of the top four to six riders are required.
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.**
- (1) Rider must meet USEF definition of being a junior rider or an amateur rider; no professional riders will be allowed to enter.
 - (2) Rider must be a Member of OHJA; if a rider becomes a Member at an OHJA Recognized Competition in which the Oklahoma 3'3" Medal Class is held, the rider must have delivered the dues and membership application to the show secretary before the rider competes in the Oklahoma 3'3" Medal Class at that OHJA Recognized Competition.
- (C) **OHJA Awards.**
- (1) A gold medal (to be provided by OHJA) and ribbons through at least sixth place will be awarded.
 - (2) First and second place riders qualify for Oklahoma 3'3" Medal Ride-Off.
11. **Oklahoma 3'3" Medal Ride-Off**
- (A) **Class Requirements.**
- (1) To be held during each Competition Year.
 - (4) To be organized by the OHJA Horse Show Committee.
 - (5) Course requirements will be consistent with courses for the Oklahoma 3'3" Medal Classes. The course will be reviewed and approved by the Horse Show Committee prior to being set by the course designer. The course must be challenging, yet jumpable, and suitable for the Oklahoma 3'3" Medal Ride-Off.
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** Open to riders who finish first or second in any Oklahoma 3'3" Medal Class held at any OHJA Recognized Competition either (i) during the Competition Year or (ii) during the preceding Competition Year if the rider qualifies for the OHJA Mini-Medal Ride-Off after it has been held in the preceding Competition Year. *Provided*, three riders must complete the course in any of the foregoing classes in order for the class to be a qualifying class for the Oklahoma 3'3" Medal Ride-Off.
- (C) **OHJA Awards.** Gold, silver, and bronze appropriate awards and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded

Hunter Seat Equitation Year End Awards

1. Requirements for Awards.

- (A) **Number of Riders.** The Equitation Year End Awards in an award category will not be awarded if less than three riders have accumulated points in the award category during the Competition Year. **Exception:** If only one rider has accumulated points in a section during the show year, that rider will be presented a year end award providing he/she has shown and placed in that section at a minimum of three different shows.
- (B) **Number of Competitions.** The Equitation Year End Awards in an award category will not be awarded if classes in which a rider may accumulate points for the award category have been conducted in less than three OHJA Recognized Competitions during the Competition Year.
- (C) **Combination/Division of Award Categories.** The award categories for the Equitation Year End Awards may be combined or divided if the entries warrant and if approved by the Board of Directors.
- (D) **Ties.** All ties for the Equitation Year End Awards will remain tied. In the event of a tie for Champion, equal awards will be presented and no Reserve Champion award will be awarded, and in the event of a tie for Reserve Champion, equal awards will be presented.

2. Requirements for Riders.

- (A) **Minimum Competitions.** To be eligible for an Equitation Year End Award, a rider must have competed in that section while a Member in a minimum of three OHJA Recognized Competitions during the Competition Year.
- (B) **Membership.** Only points won by riders who are Members at the time the points are won will count towards the Hunter Seat Equitation Year End Awards.

3. Points; Classes.

- (A) **Points.** Points for the Equitation Year End Awards will be determined according to Appendix A—Points Tables for Rated Competitions.
- (B) **OHJA Recognized Competitions.** Only points awarded at OHJA Recognized Competitions will count towards the Hunter Seat Equitation Year End Awards.
- (C) **Classes.** Classes for which Equitation Year End Awards points will be awarded are:
 - (1) The following equitation classes count toward Equitation Year End Awards: open age; open equitation; non-qualifying open equitation championship; Oklahoma Equitation classes; and local, regional, national, and international equitation medal classes that do not have a win or point restriction. Examples of medal classes that count include USEF Pony Medal and USEF Adult Equitation; examples of medal classes that do not count, because of class specs, after stated number of wins a rider cannot continue to show in that class for the balance of that show year, include USEF Hunter Seat Medal, USET, ASPCA, OHJA 3' Medal, and Washington International.
 - (2) Hunter Seat Equitation classes in the OHJA Schooling Program (Part I of this CAP Manual) do not count toward Equitation Year End Awards.
- (D) **Number of Riders.** USEF Rules will be followed (as if the USEF Rules applied to Hunter Seat Equitation classes) to determine if a class has sufficient entries for the class to count towards the Hunter Seat Equitation Year End Awards. The number of riders will be determined from the report made by the OHJA Recognized Competition. If the number of riders is not known points will be awarded on the basis of three to ten riders shown.

4. Horse/Rider Eligibility.

It is the responsibility of the rider or the owner or lessee of the horse to verify whether the rider or the horse is eligible for a section, class, or award.

Additional OHJA Hunter Seat Equitation Awards

1. Equestrian of the Year Award.

See Appendix B.

PART III—OHJA RATED HUNTER PROGRAM
Classes, Sections, and Awards

1. OHJA Pre-Green Hunter Section

- (A) **Class Requirements.** Subject to USEF Rules and Zone 7 specifications
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.**
 - (1) No cross entries between 3'0" and 3'3" at the same OHJA Recognized Competition.
 - (2) A pre-green horse is a horse of any age that has never shown in a recognized USEF Regular Member or Local Member show over fences 3'6" or higher. A horse may show in the Pre-Green Hunter Section of an OHJA Recognized Competition in no more than two Competition Years.
 - (3) A horse that does not show at more than three shows prior to May 15 of a Competition Year at 3'6" or higher, may regain his pre-green status on a one-time basis. In order to regain pre-green status, the owner must:
 - (a) Notify USEF office by letter, via certified/return receipt prior to December 1 of the Competition Year, giving the horse's name and recording number (if the horse is not recorded, the horse must be recorded at that time); and
 - (b) Notify the OHJA Points Secretary, via certified/return receipt prior to resumption of showing pre-green in order to regain pre-green status with OHJA.
- (C) **OHJA Awards.** Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horses accumulating the most points in Pre-Green Hunter classes during the Competition Year. A horse may win the Champion award in Pre-Green Hunter only once, even if the horse regains pre-green status.

2. Green Working Hunter Section

- (A) **Class Requirements.**
 - (1) Subject to USEF Rules.
 - (2) Green Working Hunter Conformation classes will count towards Year End Awards.
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** Subject to USEF Rules.
- (C) **OHJA Awards.** Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horses accumulating the most points in Green Hunter classes during the Competition Year.

3. Pony Hunter Classes

- (A) **Class Requirements.** Subject to USEF Rules.
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** Subject to USEF Rules.
- (C) **OHJA Awards.** Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the ponies accumulating the most points in Pony Hunter classes during the Competition Year.

4. Children's Hunter Classes

- (A) **Class Requirements.** Subject to USEF Rules and Zone 7 specifications .
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility:** Subject to USEF Rules and Zone 7 specifications.
- (C) **OHJA Awards.** Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horses accumulating the most points in Children's Hunter classes during the Competition Year.

5. Junior Hunter Classes

- (A) **Class Requirements.** Subject to USEF Rules.
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility:** Subject to USEF Rules and Zone 7 Rules.
- (C) **OHJA Awards.** Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horses accumulating the most points in Junior Hunter classes during the Competition Year.

6. Amateur Adult Hunter Classes

- (A) **Class Requirements.** Subject to USEF Rules and Zone 7 specifications.
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** Subject to USEF Rules and Zone 7 specifications.
- (C) **OHJA Awards.** Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horses accumulating the most points in Amateur Adult Hunter classes during the Competition Year.

7. Amateur Owner Hunter Classes

- (A) **Class Requirements.** Subject to USEF Rules.
- (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** Subject to USEF Rules.
- (C) **OHJA Awards.** Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horses accumulating the most points in Amateur Owner Hunter classes during the Competition Year.

8. Regular Hunter Classes

(A) Class Requirements.

(1) Subject to USEF Rules.

(2) Regular Working Hunter Conformation classes will count towards Year End Awards.

(B) Horse/Rider Eligibility. Subject to USEF Rules.

(C) OHJA Awards. Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horses accumulating the most points in Regular Hunter classes during the Competition Year.

Hunter Year End Awards

1. Requirements for Awards.

- (A) **Number of Horses.** The Hunter Year End Awards for an award category will not be awarded if less than three horses have accumulated points in the award category during the Competition Year. **Exception:** If only one horse has accumulated points in a section during the show year, that horse will be presented a year end award providing it has shown and placed in that section at a minimum of three different shows.
- (B) **Number of Competitions.** The Hunter Year End Awards for an award category will not be awarded if classes in which a horse may accumulate points for the award category have been conducted in less than three OHJA Recognized Competitions during the Competition Year.
- (C) **Combination/Division of Award Categories.** The award categories for the Hunter Year End Awards may be combined or divided if approved by the Board of Directors.
- (D) **Ties.** All ties for the Hunter Year End Awards will remain tied. In the event of a tie for Champion, equal awards will be presented and no Reserve Champion award will be awarded, and in the event of a tie for Reserve Champion, equal awards will be presented.

2. Requirements for Horses.

- (A) **Minimum Competitions.** Except as otherwise specifically provided, to be eligible for the Hunter Year End Award in an award category, the horse must have competed in that section in a minimum of three OHJA Recognized Competitions during the Competition Year.
- (B) **Membership.** Only points won by horses owned by OHJA Members at the time the points are won will count towards the Hunter Year End Awards.

3. Points; Classes.

- (A) **Points.** Points for the Hunter Year End Awards will be determined according to Appendix A—Points Tables for Rated Competitions.
 - (1) Classics do not count for year end awards; only Hunter I-IV and Hunter U/S.
- (B) **OHJA Recognized Competitions.** Only points awarded at OHJA Recognized Competitions will count towards the Hunter Year End Awards.
- (C) **Number of Horses.** USEF Rules will be followed to determine if a class has sufficient entries for points in the class to count towards the Hunter Year End Awards. The number of horses will be determined from the report made by the OHJA Recognized Competition. If the number of horses is not known points for Hunter Year End Awards will be awarded on the basis of three to ten horses shown.

- 4. **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** It is the responsibility of the rider or the owner or lessee of the horse to verify whether the rider or the horse is eligible for a section, class, or award.

Additional OHJA Hunter Awards

- 1. **True Blue Memorial Award.** The “True Blue Memorial Trophy” will be presented to the horse (other than a pony) accumulating the most points during the Competition Year in hunter classes (excluding OHJA Schooling Program Hunter classes, Part I of this CAP Manual). In the event of a tie for the True Blue Memorial Award the horse winning the most blue ribbons-over fences will receive the award. To be eligible for the True Blue Memorial Award the horse must have competed in hunter classes in the minimum number of OHJA Recognized Competitions during the Competition Year as determined annually by the Board of Directors.
- 2. **OHJA Pony of the Year Trophy.** The OHJA Pony of the Year Trophy will be presented to the pony accumulating the most points in Pony hunter classes, i.e. Regular Pony Working Hunter (excluding OHJA Schooling Program hunter classes, Part I of this CAP Manual) at OHJA Recognized Competitions during the Competition Year. To be eligible for the OHJA Pony of the Year Trophy the horse must have competed in hunter classes in the minimum number of OHJA Recognized Competitions during the Competition Year as determined annually by the Board of Directors.
- 3. **JESSI TURNER MEMORIAL TROPHY.** Awarded to the Junior Member, older or younger of OHJA, with the highest number of year end points in any single section. Jessi Turner was dedicated to her horses and riding well. She spent countless hours working around the stables, grooming, cleaning or helping the younger equestrians at the barn. She enjoyed a challenge, often training Mustangs that others had given up on. Jessi never met a horse she didn't love. Although Jessi was not able to fulfill her dream of one day riding for her country, if there are horse shows in Heaven, she is at the top of the class, always wanting to jump just a little higher. Jessie was a treasured gift from God; she was so full of goodness and love, it filled her and spilled out to warm the hearts of those around her. The JESSI TURNER MEMORIAL TROPHY is a tribute to Jessi, and an inspiration to young riders everywhere.

PART IV—OHJA JUMPER PROGRAM
Classes, Sections, and Awards

1. **.75 to .85 Meter Jumper (2'6" to 2'9") Section**
 - (A) **Class Requirements.** Fence heights .75M to .85M (2'6" to 2'9") with spreads to 2'9".
 - (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** Riders may be amateurs or professionals.
 - (C) **OHJA Awards.** OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horses accumulating the most points in .75M to .85 Meter Jumper classes during the Competition Year for Zone 1 & Zone 2.

2. **.90 to .95 Meter Jumper (2'11"-3'1") Section**
 - (A) **Class Requirements.** Fence heights .9M to .95M (2'11" to 3'1")
 - (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** Riders may be amateurs or professionals.
 - (C) **OHJA Awards.** OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horses accumulating the most points in .90 to .95 Meter Jumper classes during the Competition Year for Zone 1 & 2.

3. **1.0 Meter Jumper (3'3") Section**
 - (A) **Class Requirements.** Fence heights 1.0M (3'3")
 - (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** Riders may be amateurs or professionals.
 - (C) **OHJA Awards.** OHJA Zone 1 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place and OHJA Zone 2 Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horses accumulating the most points in 1.0 Meter Jumper classes during the Competition Year for Zone 1 & 2.

4. **1.05 to 1.15 Meter Jumper (3'5" to 3'9") Section**
 - (A) **Class Requirements.**
 - (1) Fence heights 1.05m to 1.15M (3'5" to 3'9")
 - (2) Class not specified Children's, Junior, Adult, or Amateur Owner.
 - (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** Riders may be amateurs or professionals.
 - (C) **OHJA Awards.** Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horses accumulating the most points in 1.05 to 1.15 Meter Jumper classes during the Competition Year.

5. **1.2 to 1.3 Meter Jumper (3'11" to 4'3") Section**
 - (A) **Class Requirements.**
 - (1) Fence heights 1.2M to 1.3M (3'11" to 4'3")
 - (2) Class not specified Children's, Junior, Adult, or Amateur Owner.
 - (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** Riders may be amateurs or professionals.
 - (C) **OHJA Awards.** Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horses accumulating the most points in 1.2 to 1.3 Meter Jumper classes during the Competition Year.

6. **Pony Jumper Section**
 - (A) **Class Requirements.** Course requirements will be in accordance with USEF Rules and Zone 7 specifications.
 - (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** In accordance with USEF Rules.
 - (C) **OHJA Awards.** Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horses accumulating the most points in Pony Jumper classes during the Competition Year.

7. **Children's and Adult Jumper Section**
 - (A) **Class Requirements.**
 - (1) Children's and Adult Jumper Section may be split into a Children's Jumper Section and an Adult Jumper Section.
 - (2) Course requirements will be in accordance with USEF Rules and Zone 7 specifications.
 - (B) **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** Riders must be children or amateur adults in accordance with USEF Rules.
 - (C) **OHJA Awards.** Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horses accumulating the most points in Children's and Adult Jumper classes during the Competition Year.

8. Amateur Owner and Junior Jumper Section

(A) Class Requirements.

- (1) The Amateur Owner and Junior Jumper Section may be split into an Amateur Owner Section and a Junior Jumper Section.
- (2) Fence heights and spreads in accordance with USEF Rules.

(B) Horse/Rider Eligibility. Riders must be amateur owners or juniors in accordance with USEF Rules.

(C) OHJA Awards. Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horses accumulating the most money in Amateur Owner Jumper and Junior Jumper classes during the Competition Year.

9. 1.35 to 1.45 Meter Jumper (4'5" to 4'9") Section

(A) Class Requirements.

- (1) Fence heights 1.35m to 1.45M (4'6" to 4'9")
- (2) Class not specified Amateur Owner or Junior.

(B) Horse/Rider Eligibility. Riders may be amateurs or professionals.

(C) OHJA Awards. Year End Champion, Reserve Champion, and ribbons through eighth place will be awarded to the horses winning the most money in 1.35 to 1.45 Meter Jumper classes during the Competition Year.

10. Mules in Jumping Classes. After conferring with USHJA and USEF, in order to be in agreement with both of the national associations "Mules are not allowed to compete in regular classes held by a horse show. A show may offer a demonstration at their show where mules are allowed to jump in a demonstration or exhibition. However, no points will be given or awarded toward any class or championship at that show that is recognized by OHJA."

Jumper Year End Awards

1. Requirements for Awards.

- (A) **Number of Horses.** The Jumper Year End Awards for an award category will not be awarded if less than three horses have accumulated points in the award category during the Competition Year. **Exception: If only one horse has accumulated points in a section during the show year, that rider will be presented a year end award providing it has shown and placed in that section at a minimum of three different shows.**
- (B) **Number of Competitions.** The Jumper Year End Awards for an award category will not be awarded if classes in which a rider may accumulate points for the award category have been conducted in less than three OHJA Recognized Competitions during the Competition Year.
- (C) **Combination/Division of Award Categories.** The award categories for the Jumper Year End Awards may be combined or divided if the entries warrant and if approved by the Board of Directors.
- (D) **Ties.** All ties for the Jumper Year End Awards will remain tied. In the event of a tie for Champion, equal awards will be presented and no Reserve Champion award will be awarded, and in the event of a tie for Reserve Champion, equal awards will be presented.

2. Requirements for Horses.

- (A) **Minimum Competitions.** Except as otherwise specifically provided, to be eligible for the Jumper Year End Award in an award category, the horse must have competed in that section at a minimum of three OHJA Recognized Competitions during the Competition Year.
- (B) **Membership.** Only points earned by horses owned by Members at the time the points are earned will count towards the Jumper Year End Awards.

3. Points; Classes.

- (A) Classics do not count for year end awards; only Jumper I-IV classes count for points.
- (B) **OHJA Recognized Competitions.** Only points awarded at OHJA Recognized Competitions will count towards the Jumper Year End Awards.
- (C) **Number of Horses.** USEF Rules will be followed to determine if a class has sufficient entries for points in the class to count towards the Jumper Year End Awards. The number of horses will be determined from the report made by the OHJA Recognized Competition. If the number of horses is not known points for Jumper Year End Awards will be awarded on the basis of three to ten horses shown.

- 4. **Horse/Rider Eligibility.** It is the responsibility of the rider or the owner or lessee of the horse to verify whether the rider or the horse is eligible for a section, class, or award.

Additional OHJA Jumper Awards

- 1. **OHJA Jumper of the Year Trophy.** The OHJA Jumper of the Year Trophy will be presented to the horse (other than a pony) accumulating the most money at OHJA Recognized Competitions during the Competition Year. To be eligible for the OHJA Jumper of the Year Trophy, the horse must have competed in jumper classes in the minimum number of OHJA Recognized Competitions during the Competition Year as determined annually each year by the Board of Directors.

Bonafide Memorial The Bonafide Memorial Trophy was donated by Carlye Rose Graydon and Judie Blumenthal and is awarded to the OHJA rider accumulating the most points in Junior Hunt Seat Equitation classes, over fences and on the flat during the competition year at OHJA recognized shows. This trophy is in memory of the small liver chestnut thoroughbred gelding named Bonafide, better known as “Fred,” who graced the equitation and hunter record books in Oklahoma and across the country. Bonafide's and Carlye's first competition year together spanned only 6 short months. In this time he swept the OHJA Equitation division as well as the Small Junior Hunter division, won 3 USEF Medals, 1 USET Medal, 2 ASPCA Maclay medals, and had 21 wins or second places in Equitation flat and/or over fence classes. Bonafide was also USEF Zone VII reserve champion in Small Junior Hunter that year. In addition, that year, they qualified for and attended the Maclay Semifinals in St. Louis, Missouri, and qualified for and attended the USEF Medal Finals in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. The following year, Bonafide and Carlye won the Oklahoma Medal Final, USEF Adult Medal, and had 13 equitation wins over fences and/or on the flat. The subsequent 2 years Bonafide took two junior riders to the Maclay semifinals, with those riders winning numerous USEF Medals, ASPCA Medals, USET Medals, over fence and flat equitation classes. Bonafide died August 9, 2006 at the age of 26. The Bonafide Memorial Trophy will be retired in the year 2016 when it will be presented back to Carlye and Judie.

San Jose Memorial Trophy for Amateur-Owner Hunters. The San Jose Memorial Trophy was awarded to the high-point, Oklahoma-Owned Amateur-Owner Hunter from 1991 through 2002. If the section was split and both younger and older group awards were given, this award was presented to the older group winner. The trophy was presented by Dr. Gene Reynolds in memory of the dark brown, 16.3 hand thoroughbred gelding, San Jose, who died in March of 1991 at age 27. Having just two owners in his life (The Pape Family of Oklahoma City and Gene Reynolds of Tulsa), San Jose's career was varied. He took part in dressage and steeplechase events and was champion many times in the Regular Working, Junior, and Amateur-Owner Hunter sections. He was among the first group of horses to be registered by OHJA, and competed at the very first OHJA show. Since that show finished after dark, automobiles surrounded the arena and he completed his courses in a ring illuminated by car lights.

Mr. Hill learned about hard work and horses at an early age. As a boy he often held a lantern while his father, a Kiefer blacksmith, shod the huge draft horses used to develop the Oklahoma oil fields. A lifelong outdoorsman, Mr. Hill enjoyed riding in a variety of settings. In the fall he would hunt on horseback in Colorado. As a founder of the Pottawatomie County Sportsmen's Club he would patrol the Shawnee Lake area. And as a member of the Shawnee Round-Up Club he participated in numerous mounted parades down Main Street. Mr. Hill's involvement with horses lasted most of his life although he was a committed businessman and civic leader in Shawnee for over 40 years. He continued to support and encourage riders of all ages and abilities including the local therapeutic riding program at St. Gregory's College. Mr. Hill was a man of integrity who lived simply. To him "attitude and determination" were everything and it is in that spirit this trophy is dedicated. This trophy will be retired after it is awarded in 2006 and will be returned to Beth Nellis, daughter of Mr. Hill.
